## **Additional considerations**

Scouts may want to consider completing all requirements, including the District Eagle Board of Review, BEFORE the start of the senior year of high school, so that the rank of Eagle can be included on college applications. Substitute August 1 of your senior year in place of your 18th birthday and adjust dates accordingly. It CAN make a difference!

Eagle projects must show LEADERSHIP. Consider projects that require you to direct, and effectively use the assistance of, scouts and adults. The project has to benefit some organization other than Boy Scouts. Generally the organization is a non-profit organization; if the sponsor is a for-profit organization, discuss with the District Eagle Coordinator before drafting the proposal. Projects cannot be started before approval is secured from the Scoutmaster, Troop Committee, and the District Eagle Coordinator.

Scouts are encouraged to discuss possible Eagle Scout projects with the Scoutmaster upon achieving Life scout rank.

The dates shown in the timeline include a little wiggle room, for example 6 months for Life + 1 month to get the Board of Review arranged and completed = 7 months. Don't wait until the last minute to schedule Boards or complete requirements.

If ALL other requirements are completed, the District Eagle Board can be scheduled within 90 days after the scout's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. (No requirements can be completed on or after the scout's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday – all written material must be completed prior to the scout's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday.) The complete Eagle package must be reviewed by the District Eagle Coordinator prior to your 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. We do not encourage waiting this long since there may be no opportunity to correct problems should some requirement be found incomplete by the district or council.

Note: You must meet with the District Eagle Coordinator MORE THAN one week prior the District Eagle Board of Review.

Please contact the District Eagle Coordinator if you have any question regarding Eagle Requirements or process.

This Timeline is not intended to be all-inclusive – it is a guideline, not a checklist. Review the requirements in your scout book to be sure all requirements are completed.
